Obituary - Lyle R Hawk, was born on April 10, 1933 in Abilene, Kansas to Rufus and Pearl Hawk and moved to his eternal home on May 4, 2017. He invested into people leaving a living heritage of: family, friends, co-workers and total strangers who were blessed by his time here.

The summation of his life can be summed up into one word: Legacy.

After high school and on the flip of a coin, he and a friend moved to Phoenix in 1952 where he graduated from Phoenix College in 1954. Lyle began working at Phoenix Newspapers, Inc. from 1954 to 1956, then served as a sergeant with the Army in Japan before returning to Phoenix in 1956 resuming his work at the newspaper while attending ASU.

Lyle met Judith Ulmer in 1956 and they were married August 11, 1957 at Mt. Of Olives Lutheran Church in Phoenix. They purchased their first home in Scottsdale. Lyle loved newspaper work and continued in various positions including Plant Manager before retiring in 1992 after forty years of service. After retirement he switched careers to partner with his son Bryan at Focus Display Solutions until the present. Lyle was preceded in death by his oldest son Tempe Officer Robert Lyle Hawk and his daughter-in-law Toni Hawk Kuhl. Siblings who preceded him were Veryln, Delmar, and Orville Hawk, Loretta Moore and Beulah Priem. Lyle is survived by his wife of 60 years, Judy, sons Philip Hawk(Tracy) and Bryan Hawk(Teresa) and Kurt Kuhl. Grandchildren are Matthew and Adam Hawk(Marissa), Cassandra and Callie Hawk, Carissa Lara(Eric) Patrick Kuhl, Grant(Danielle) and Lee Neiman. Great-grandchildren, Drake and Renae Neiman. And his brother and sister-in law: Tom and Kay Ulmer.

Lyle had a deep faith in Jesus. Ephesians 2:8,9 and invested most of his life into family and honoring God. They were first in his life. He enjoyed playing golf with his buddies, spending time at his second home in Forest Lakes that they purchased in 1977, model trains, the Cardinals and Diamondbacks and was active in Little League, scouting, teaching Sunday school and spending time with children at East Valley Child Crisis Center. His family attended Abiding Savior Lutheran Church for many years. Lyle attended Scottsdale Bible Church.

Services were held on Wednesday, May 10th, at Messinger Mortuary in Scottsdale, followed by a Private Family Internment on Thursday at Green Acres Mortuary & Cemetery.

Very Important Information from the Black Mesa Ranger District

Property owners in the Forest Lakes subdivision ----- Access from an individual homeowner's properties who border directly onto National Forest lands is not authorized by the U.S. Forest Service. Authorized access to National Forest lands can only be by adjacent National Forest roads, unless otherwise permitted.

If your property borders the National Forest and you have paths behind your property onto the federal lands, please remove them and restore them as best as you can. If you don't, you will be receiving a visit sometime this summer from a U. S. Forest Service Official. Thank you, residents, for being in compliance.

Remember, too, that on Red Flag Warning days, you are not to be on forest property.

I wrote: "**Remember, too, that on Red Flag Warning days, you are not to be on forest property.**" Correction: The only time you cannot enter, stay, or use any portion of the National Forest is during a Stage III Fire Restrictions when it is closed.

I could have had a contest to see who caught the "fake news"!! That's what happens when I write late in the evening! I'm sure all of you that live on the forest border, and especially Ranger Chris James are wondering.....what the heck??!!
