Subject: Today's prescribed burn report

Firing operations will resume this morning focusing on the north side of the subdivision. One team is starting at the 99 and 99A road and another team is working on the west side near Ryan Ranch. The goal is to treat the entire northern block with the hope of turning south along the 99 road on the east side of the subdivision. Forest Service firefighters will be in the subdivision monitoring and patrolling keeping a close watch on the fire line.

I have received many calls asking about small trees along the highway and trees that border private property. All fuel types and burn areas have been taken into consideration by the management team and a buffer along the highway and private property has been established for firefighter safety and for the safety of our community.
