



WOODS WATCH PROGRAM

Forest Lakes, AZ



Concerns regarding very dry conditions and the impending Wildland Fire Season are on the minds of many community members who live in cities and unincorporated areas throughout Coconino County. The Coconino County Sheriff's Office and the US Forest Service are offering "Woods Watch" training and orientation. This volunteer program is similar to Neighborhood Watch and is of vital importance in residential areas that interface with forested land. Volunteers are asked to watch for people accessing closed areas of the forest and for people who are using fire carelessly or against current fire restrictions.

The Woods Watch Training is approximately 2 hours in duration. The Sheriff's Office would like to ask residents of the Greater Forest Lakes Area to participate in this program and assist the Sheriff's Office and the US Forest Service in keeping your community safe.
